DEAR FRIENDS

2018 was a year where The Franklin P. and Arthur W. Perdue Foundation found ways to make a difference in the communities Perdue calls home – not only to fund programs that make a difference in the lives of our neighbors but also to make a difference quickly and with intention. Devastating storms, fires and floods in numerous regions where our associates live drove the Foundation to quick action. Grants to The American Red Cross, numerous food banks and several relief and recovery programs were made to help our friends and neighbors in need. Of course, awards were also made to fund other initiatives true to our mission to invest in fighting hunger and poverty, bettering the environment, creating educational programming, improving health care, and addressing social causes. 2018 truly was a year when Perdue and the Perdue Family were able to demonstrate our love for community and our desire to make those communities better.

In the past year, 214 grants were awarded totaling \$3,024,870. Some awards and activities worthy of highlight were:

- More than \$30,000 was awarded to volunteer fire departments in the communities that Perdue calls home. We are honored to support the efforts of our first responders and assure their equipment is state of the art to prepare them for aiding our neighbors in need.
- Mother Nature showed her strength in many regions of our country in 2018. The Perdue Foundation responded in quick action not only through grants to those local chapters of the American Red Cross but also through generous contributions by the Perdue Family Council and designated funds from many Perdue family members toward recovery efforts.
- The opioid crisis in America has hit hard many of the regions where Perdue associates live and work. In 2018, we responded with gifts and pledges toward five organizations that work toward recovery, rehabilitation and reinvigoration of those who have been struck by this crisis.
- STEM careers may be a more realistic reality for students from the rural areas of the Eastern Shore of Maryland due to a grant from the Perdue Foundation of \$60,000 to the Tri-County Council to help fund their “mobile maker space” that will house high tech tools and equipment so the M4Reactor can travel to area schools and community events.
- Fighting hunger and poverty is something we focus on every day – we believe no one in America should be hungry. Grants to eighteen feeding programs (nearly a quarter of our grants budget) demonstrate our desire to address this problem in our country.




